

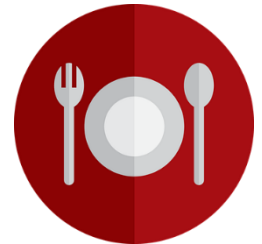

- ✓ Swedish homework help – beginner-intermediate level. The course takes place on Mondays, from 9,30 to 11.30 with an experienced Swedish teacher who also speaks Russian and Ukrainian. Register your interest at eucenter@fralsningsarmen.se or our reception.
- ✓ English courses – from beginner to advanced level, with a very experienced and competent teacher. Courses take place either at our center, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, or can be taken online, on Mondays and Wednesdays. Register your interest at eucenter@fralsningsarmen.se or our reception.

- ✓ Information about how certain things work in Sweden and assistance wherever possible.
